



Celebrating Our Past - Inspiring Our Future

In the late 1960's, Dr. Karl Bleyl, a Cy-Fair educator and science consultant, launched a movement to create a scholarship fund for Cypress-Fairbanks ISD students. Joined by community leaders and educators – Allen Labay, then superintendent of Cypress-Fairbanks ISD (CFISD); Reverend F.J. Aragon, pastor of Christ United Church; Jim Blackman, shipping manager for Foley's and attorney Herman Mead – the Cy-Fair Educational Foundation (CFEF) was established in 1970 to raise money to fund scholarships for graduating seniors from Cypress-Fairbanks ISD. In 1971, the Cy-Fair Educational Foundation awarded its first three scholarships totaling \$2,350 to graduating seniors from the district's only high school, Cy-Fair High School.

Over the past 54 years, the Foundation has kept pace with the growth in Cypress-Fairbanks ISD (CFISD). We could not have done this without the generosity of the Cy-Fair community and the commitment of our board of trustees. CFEF is close to awarding \$1 million annually in scholarships to graduating seniors from CFISD through our over 140 endowed scholarships.

Every April, CFEF trustees form 12 scholarship committees and personally read all essays submitted by the scholarship applicants. They combine each applicant's objective application score with their essay score, creating a list of possible recipients for each campus. The Scholarship Committee chairs then convene and award our scholarships across the 12 CFISD high schools.

The Foundation hosts five fundraising events annually. Salute to Our Heroes has honored military and first responders for 16 years. The Houston Methodist Cy-Hoops Invitational will host its 15th annual tournament on the courts at the Berry Center this December. Salute to the Stars will mark 28 years of celebrating CFISD Teacher of the Year honorees in March 2025. Finally, the B.F. Adam Golf Classic will host its 38th annual tournament in May 2025 followed by our newest event, the Sporting Clay Tournament in August 2025. These events, along with our Donate to Educate program and the Superintendent's Fun Run have provided CFEF with the means to grow our vision of "Empowering Today's Students – Tomorrow's Leaders through Higher Education."

This past June, the Foundation awarded scholarships totaling over \$902,000 to 143 graduating seniors from CFISD. The Cy-Fair Educational Foundation has awarded over \$13.4 million in scholarships and more than \$4.5 million for staff development programs. The Foundation is excited about our ability to continue to play a role in the success of students from CFISD through college and dual credit scholarships and staff development programs. With the steadfast support of the Cy-Fair community and the growth of our scholarship endowment program, CFEF will continue to inspire the futures of Cypress-Fairbanks ISD students.

Bill Brown retired after 2020, his 34th year with the Houston Astros organization, and his fourth as a Community Outreach Executive. Brown called his final games as the Astros primary TV play-by-play broadcaster in 2016 after 30 years in the booth. From 1976-1982, he was the TV play-by-play voice for the Cincinnati Reds, giving him 37 years as a baseball broadcaster.

Bill was inducted into the Texas Baseball Hall of Fame in 2004, the

Houston Media Wall of Honor in 2011 and the Smith-Cotton High School Athletic Hall of Fame in 2017 in Sedalia, Missouri. In 2013 he was voted Texas Sportscaster of the Year by his peers in the NSSA. Bill was a recipient of the Fred Hartman Long and Meritorious Service Award in 2012. The Texas Italian American Sports Foundation presented him with a community service award in 2016. In August Bill was inducted into the Astros Hall of Fame Class of 2023.

Bill and his wife Dianne have been members of the Salute to Our Heroes Committee for 15 years. They were married in 1969 after graduating from the University of Missouri. Their daughter Allison graduated from Cy-Fair High School. She lives in Minnesota with her husband and three children. Bill served in the U.S. Army from 1970-1971 and is a Vietnam Veteran.

Bill has co-authored three books, *My Baseball Journey*, *Houston Astros: Deep in the Heart, and Houston Astros' Golden Era.* He has also written *Breathing Orange Fire: Jose Altuve, Houston's Team, Houston's Title, Astros' Golden Era, After the Ring, "60", Sportscasting 101*, and "Swinging for Glory" (a baseball novel).

As you entered the dining area, you may have noticed a table at the front, raised to call your attention to its purpose—it is reserved to honor our missing loved ones [or missing comrades in arms, for veterans].

Set for six, the empty places represent Americans still missing from each of the five services— Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force, Coast Guard—and civilians. This Honors Ceremony symbolizes that they are with us, here in spirit.

Some in this room were very young when they were sent into combat; however, all Americans should never forget the brave men and women who answered our nation's call [to serve] and served the cause of freedom in a special way.

Each item on this special table has a meaning:

The table is round—to show our everlasting concern for our missing men.

The tablecloth is white—symbolizing the purity of their motives when answering the call to duty.

The single red rose reminds us of the life of each of the missing, and the loved ones and friends of these Americans who keep the faith, awaiting answers.

The vase is tied with a red ribbon, symbol of our continued determination to account for our missing.

A slice of lemon on the bread plate is to remind us of the bitter fate of those captured and missing in a foreign land.

A pinch of salt symbolizes the tears endured by those missing and their families who seek answers.

The Bible represents the strength gained through faith to sustain those lost from our country, founded as one nation under God.

The glass is inverted—to symbolize their inability to share this evening's toast.

The chairs are empty—they are missing.

When we raise our water glasses, we will toast to honor America's POW/MIA's and to the success of our efforts to account for them.

Jeremy Ray was an officer in the United States Army, 1st Squadron, 3rd Armored Calvary Regiment at Fort Hood. On December 20, 2007, Ray was killed in action. He had been in Iraq only 44 days. His unit was providing security at a council meeting in Kanaan where local tribal leaders were working to promote peace in Northeast Iraq. A suicide bomber targeted Ray's unit, riding up on a bike and detonating a bomb. Ray took the brunt of the explosion. He was the only member of his unit to lose his life.

An Eagle Scout, Ray played football for the Jersey Village Falcons. He was a member of the Texas A&M Corps of Cadets, Company H-1 and graduated from A&M in 2006. Ray spent his life in service to his community and country.

Salute to Our Heroes honors the brave men and women who have served to protect our freedom and liberty. Ray was first remembered for his role as a soldier and peacekeeper at the Cy-Fair Educational Foundation's inaugural Salute to Our Heroes in February 2009. "I want people to see my brother and see somebody who embodies every aspect of patriotism and sacrifice, and I want that lesson to be handed down from generation to generation to generation," said Justin Ray, Jeremy's brother.

Every year since, the Foundation has recognized a community member, organization or company which best personifies community service, service to our armed forces, or promotes peace with the 1st Lieutenant Jeremy Ray Community Service and Peace Award. This year we honor Timothy Stroud for his commitment to helping veterans' return to civilian life. Stroud is an expert on transitional services for veterans from education and employment to homelessness and support service.





During his 30 years with State Farm, Jerry was recognized


