



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
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# MASTER OF CEREMONIES: BUTCH MILKS

Stephen is the lead pastor of the Cypress Campus of Second Baptist Church where he has served for the past 19 years. Before answering the call to ministry 26 years ago, Stephen served in public education as an English teacher and coach. He received his bachelor's from Texas A&M and his Master of Divinity from Southwest Baptist Theological Seminary. He is currently working on his Doctorate of Ministry from Liberty University.

Stephen has served on the CFISD Long Range Planning Committee and is currently serving on the CFSID Leadership Team. The church where he serves has adopted three CFISD schools and continues to partner with public education as much as possible. He and Tiffani enjoy all Houston sports, the Aggies and attending many CFISD games and performances. Stephen also enjoys working out and pickle ball.



#### GUEST EMCEE: CHINEY OGWUMIKE

Chiney Ogwumike is a two-time WNBA All-Star, ESPN host and Founder of the Queens of the Continent Foundation.

As the 1<sup>st</sup> overall pick in the 2014 WNBA Draft from Stanford University, Ogwumike was the 2014 WNBA Rookie of the Year, became a two-Time WNBA All-Star (2014, 2018) and served as the vice president of the WNBA Players Association (WNBPA) from 2018-2022.

After initially joining ESPN in 2017 to co-anchor SportsCenter across Africa and work as a WNBA and NBA analyst in-studio, Ogwumike became a full-time multi-platform ESPN NBA Analyst by 2018. Not only did she become one of the youngest national sports studio analysts, she was also one of the only full-time professional athletes to simultaneously hold a regular national sports media



position. In her role, she makes regular appearances as an NBA studio analyst on SportsCenter, First Take, Get Up!, NBA Today, and NBA Countdown. In August 2020, Ogwumike also became the first Black woman to host a national, daily sports talk radio show. A 2021 Forbes 30 Under 30 honoree, she also holds the title of Executive Producer, having produced the ESPN Films documentary "144" about the 2020 WNBA season.

Ogwumike, a proud first-generation Nigerian-American, is deeply passionate about giving back and empowering the next generation. A 6'4" forward from Cypress, Texas, she graduated from Stanford University with an International Relations degree under the mentorship of Dr. Condoleezza Rice.

Ogwumike uses her platform to elevate the women's game through her color commentary and advocacy, serving as the youngest woman on the White House's inaugural advisory council on African Diaspora Engagement, which aims to strengthen cultural, social, political, and economic connections between the United States and Africa by fostering dialogue between political leaders and members of the African Diaspora, and was sworn in by Vice President Kamala Harris. Ogwumike has also made numerous trips to Africa with NBA Africa and other nonprofits to help launch youth engagement initiatives, using basketball as a tool for development. Last year, she and the White House council partnered with NBA Africa in Nigeria to host the country's first-ever Jr. NBA and Jr. WNBA elite camps, which aimed to enhance sports infrastructure, engage the continent's unparalleled talent, and destigmatize sports for girls, enabling them to pursue their dreams. Most recently in her role on the White House's Inaugural Council, she traveled to Angola to aid the President in continuing to build infrastructure investment in the region.

This past year also saw Ogwumike and her ESPN studio crew named one of Sports Illustrated's 50 Most Influential People in Sports for amplifying the boom in women's basketball, and Ogwumike was named one of Marie Claire's Changemakers of 2024 for her advocacy work and many trips to Nigeria and throughout Africa. Most recently, she announced her foundation, Queens of the Continent, live on-stage at the Global Business Africa Initiative United Nations Summit. The foundation aims to create opportunities for women and girls across Africa, using sport as a transformative vehicle to promote gender equity and access to opportunities.

#### LINDA ADAM

Linda Adam was born on September 4, 1939. After marrying the love of her life, Bob Adam, she moved to Houston, Texas, where she continued her teaching career for 13 years. Linda had a deep passion for the English language—she loved mapping sentences, great literature, and, above all, the students in her classroom. She believed wholeheartedly in education and the value of a well-crafted sentence.

Linda lived a life that radiated joy, faith, and love, serving as a beautiful example of how to embrace life and honor the Lord. She and Bob raised three daughters, two of whom now serve on the Cy-Fair Educational Foundation Board, and were blessed with eight grandchildren. Together, Linda and Bob built a family legacy that remains deeply intertwined with the foundation's mission.




Linda dedicated her time to volunteering at the B.F. Adam Golf Tournament, an event named in honor of her father-in-law, Bernard Fred (B.F.) Adam, a lifelong Cy-Fair resident and devoted school board member who served for 24 years. She was instrumental in organizing and coordinating retired educators to manage the event's registration, ensuring a smooth and welcoming experience for participants. Her unwavering commitment to education and service continues to inspire and uplift the Cy-Fair community.

Linda & Bob Adam's philanthropic efforts have left an enduring impact on education. Their generosity, exceeding \$2 million in endowments, funds scholarships that support twelve CFISD students each year in pursuing higher education. 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#### A Look Back

In 1998, Richard E. Berry, Cypress-Fairbanks ISD (CFISD) Superintendent envisioned honoring CFISD Spotlight Teachers at a gala. Berry had tremendous appreciation for the teachers of the district and wanted to recognize their inspiration, innovation, and dedication to the students of CFISD, while raising money for the Cy-Fair Educational Foundation.

A Salute to the Stars Gala Committee led by Co-Chairs, Kim Watson and John Fox, worked with Pam Scott, Director of Partners in Education, to take Berry's vision and plan the inaugural gala which would recognize 50 Spotlight Teachers. The gala took place in the newly opened Cypress Springs High School with dinner catered by Boston Market and dessert from The Cheesecake Factory. Committee members transformed the cafeteria creating an Oscar worthy evening. Butch Milks was Master of Ceremonies and Cypress Creek Scholarship recipient Lisa Stewart was the guest speaker.


Five years later, the district began a season of tremendous growth. In 2006, the gala moved from a high school cafeteria to the Richard E. Berry Educational Support Center. By 2010, Salute to the Stars was celebrating 71 Spotlight Teachers and in 2023 the number had grown to 93 teacher honorees, plus 2 paraeducators and 2 support staff honorees.

Over the past 28 years, support from the Cy-Fair community has been incredible. As CFISD grew, community businesses continually showed their support for the gala. Many of the business here tonight have supported Salute to the Stars from the beginning and many new Cy-Fair businesses have joined the Foundation as the gala has grown.

Partnering with the District to celebrate 28 years of outstanding educators has been a privilege. The Foundation looks forward to recognizing the next 28 years of honorees. Salute to the Stars has raised almost \$5 million for staff development programs and scholarships for graduating seniors from Cypress- Fairbanks ISD.


